MAY DEMONSTRATION

Our May demonstrator was Joe Krebsbach on hollowing tools. Joe went through all the different hollowing tools he has at his shop and gave the pros and cons on each of these tools. He passed around the tool heads so you could see how sharp they are and how you could adjust the angle on some of them. Joe talked about safety precautions you should use when hollowing. He explained when hollowing smaller projects how much the tool should be over the tool rest. Joe placed a larger block of wood on the lathe and showed how to setup the hollowing tool and how to use the hollowing system. There was a lively discussion and Joe answered many question from the group. Thanks Joe for a job well done!

LAST MEETING BEFORE SUMMER BREAK

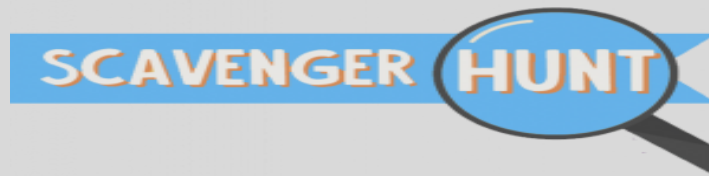
