Covid Update

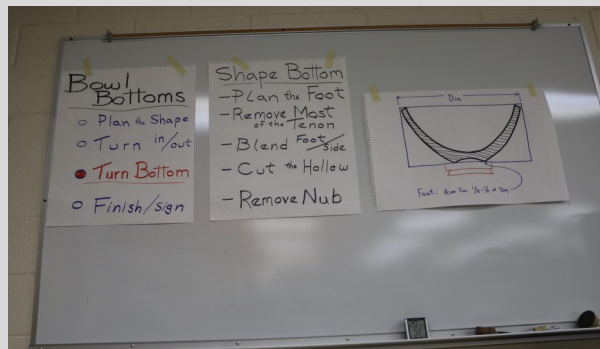

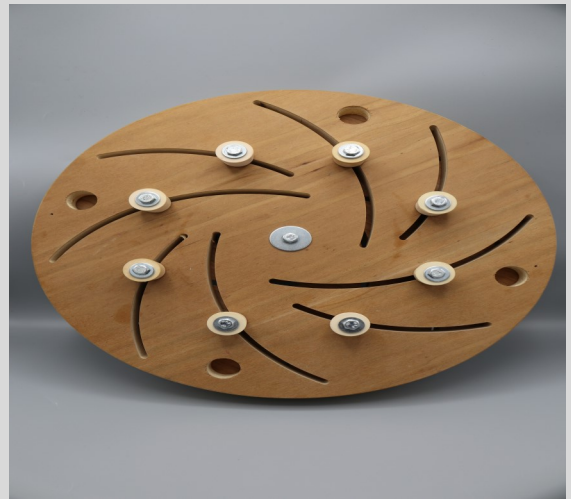
Nib on Bottom of Bowl

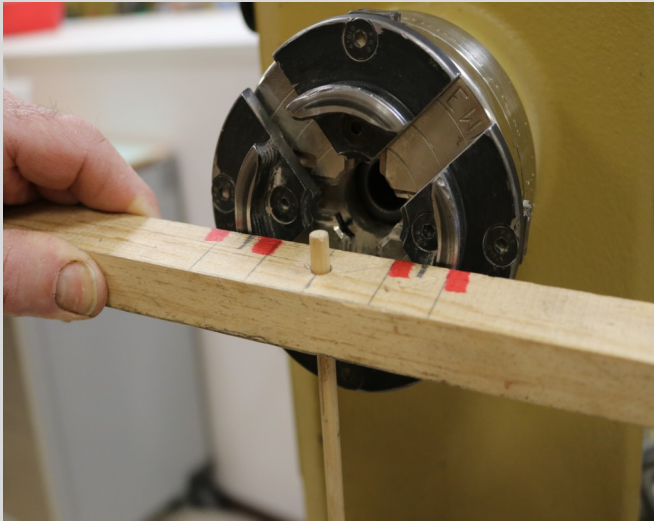

Most of us have small pieces of wood that we're not sure what to do with. To use up some of these odds and ends this month's mini challenge will be to make a golf tee. There is a small article in the February 2022 American Woodturner Journal (Page 12). For beginners it's a great learning tool for small precise cuts. For more advanced turners try making the tee only using a skew, or try burning lines in the tee, or gluing up exotic woods. Try offset turning and make a crooked tee because if you have a hook or a slice maybe a crooked tee may help and you may invent the next greatest golf tool. Happy Turning!
