Our January demonstration was the Basket Weave Illusion. Pete Schuh took us through all the steps in making the illusion. He showed how to mark the lines on the platter, then he cut the beads and burned the lines between the beads. He demonstrated how to use the wood burner to make the weave illusion. Pete then went through his pattern and showed what markers he used, how to count the squares to color each row to get the weave illusion. **HEART**  
Empowering the People of Africa to Survive and *to Thrive Beyond* the HIV/AIDS Pandemic

Rick VanSistine showed a video and updated us on the Heart program in Kenya. This program has changed lives.

Last year, many of us at BayLake Woodturners helped build a bicycle peddle powered lathe to send to Kenya - video of this project is on HEART website main page. This lathe, tools and our turners, through HEART have been giving others a source of income, pride and an option for life rather than being outcast, starving and dying.

HEART (<https://africaheart.com>) stands for Health Education Africa Resource Team and started in 2000 to empower the people of Africa to survive the HIV/AIDS pandemic of sub-Saharan Africa which left behind 14.8 million orphaned children. HEART has focused on orphan prevention verses orphan care by concentrating on caring for HIV positive mothers.

HEART is a Christian humanitarian organization, registered 501(c)(3) nonprofit in the U.S.A. and a registered TRUST in Kenya. HEART is providing medical care, general school education, and income generating activities to create a healthy, sustainable, disease-free life. They have many other active projects such as having distributed more than 85,000 malaria prevention mosquito nets.

Club member Kenneth Zaremski has arranged to purchase woodturning bottle stopper kits from Ruth Niles. Ruth has been generous with this project in the past and has again agreed to sell us bottle stopper kits for a few pennies above cost (<https://nilesbottlestoppers.com>). They will be ready to send to Africa on the next trip leaving March 19th. Ken is encouraging others to bring and donate money at the next meeting on Feb 16th to purchase bottle stopper kits and tools to send with member Ric VanSistine and others making another humanitarian trip in March.

We started January off with a fun “OOPS” Gallery. Members brought in items that didn’t quite make it. There was a lot of discussion on what happened to the piece, how to prevent it on the next piece and how to try and save the piece.
